ANNUAL events

Dana Point provides endless opportunities to enjoy the local culture and events, year-round. Signature annual events range from multi-day music festivals with top performers to creative surfing competitions. There's always something going on in the ocean, on the beach, or under the sun.

March:

FESTIVAL OF WHALES

See why Dana Point is the Dolphin and Whale Watching Capital of the World™. A tradition for nearly 50 years, the two-weekend Festival features a parade, street fair, and of course, whale-watching excursions. The timing in March correlates with peak gray whale migration.

May:

DOHENY BLUES FESTIVAL

For more than two decades, this intimate rock, soul, and blues festival has drawn 15,000 visitors to Sea Terrace Community park near Salt Creek Beach. Blues legends Etta James, Gregg Allman, and B.B. King have all graced the stages.

September:

OHANA FESTIVAL

One of the top music festivals in the United States, Ohana features three days of mind-blowing music and unforgettable ocean views, courtesy of its location on Doheny State Beach. Past headliners include Eric Church, Norah Jones, Eddie Vedder and Mumford & Sons.

September:

TALL SHIPS FESTIVAL

In celebration of California's rich maritime history, the Ocean Institute annually hosts a fleet of historic tall ships that sail into Dana Point Harbor. Expect cannon battles, pirate adventures, ship tours, and a sunset parade in the Harbor.

November:

DANA POINT TURKEY TROT

With the slogan "Run the race before you stuff your face," the Dana Point Turkey Trot has become the premiere Thanksgiving morning tradition in Orange County. It was named one of America's best Thanksgiving Day runs by Fitness Magazine, and led to Dana Point's designation as one of the top Thanksgiving destinations in the world by Fodor's Travel. Don't miss the costume contest or post-race beer garden.

November:

SURFING SANTA

A two-day surf and stand up paddleboard (SUP) contest unlike any other, contestants dress like Santa or other holiday-inspired characters while they compete on the waves of Salt Creek Beach. The event benefits local nonprofit Surfers Healing, and is organized by The Ritz-Carlton, Laguna Niguel.

Monthly, May-December:

YAPPY HOUR

Where else can you have cocktails with your dog on an ocean overlook? Canines and their owners enjoy outdoor barbecue and libations at The Ritz-Carlton, Laguna Niguel lawn, and event proceeds support a local nonprofit.

A deeper ocean EXPERIENCE

As a premier coastal destination, Dana Point welcomes all visitors to an adventure on or in the water. Luckily, Dana Point's ocean access couldn't be easier: simply pull onto State Route 1 — also known as the Pacific Coast Highway — for quick access to six unique beaches and the storied Dana Point Harbor.

SUN, SAND, AND SURFING

While you can sunbathe and swim at every beach in Dana Point, Doheny State Beach's mild waves make it an ideal spot to learn surfing and bodyboarding. More experienced surfers head to Salt Creek Beach and Strands Beach for challenging swells, and both beaches contain tide pools for exploring. Head to Capistrano Beach for volleyball, basketball, and cycling, or Monarch Beach for a romantic evening stroll. Baby Beach offers the calmest waves and plenty of nearby restrooms and restaurants for families.



A HISTORIC WAVE HAVEN

Long before it was incorporated as a town in 1989, Dana Point had an international impact as one of the birthplaces of surf culture. Local surfing enthusiasts in the 1950s flocked to the area to test their luck on the legendary surf break, Killer Dana. Though the construction of Dana Point Harbor in 1966 disbanded Killer Dana's waves, the town's surfing heritage lives on through its cultural contributions.

In Dana Point:

- Hobie Alter created the first foam surfboard and opened the world's first retail surf shop in 1954
- John Severson founded Surfer Magazine in 1962
- Bruce Brown Films produced *The Endless Summer*, often considered the most iconic surf film, in 1966

Want more history? Head the to Surfing Heritage and Culture Center in nearby San Clemente, which displays the world's largest collection of surf memorabilia and historic surfboards.



DANA POINT HARBOR: WHERE OCEAN ADVENTURES AWAIT

A beloved hub of Southern California ocean activity, Dana Point Harbor offers immediate access to the water and permanent and guest slips for more than 2,500 boats.

Within the Harbor, learn about marine life at the Ocean Institute and survey the sea creatures' habitats in nearby tide pools. Hop on the Catalina Express for a day trip to lovely Catalina Island, or build sand castles on kid-friendly Baby Beach. Join whale watching or deep sea fishing expeditions, sail on a yacht, or relax on a sunset wine cruise. For a workout, try stand up paddleboarding (SUP), diving, or kayaking. If you're hungry or need retail therapy, enjoy over 30 dining and shopping options right on the waterfront. The possibilities are endless.

BOURBON STEAK

With a concept by Michelin star-awarded chef Michael Mina, Bourbon Steak features prime cuts of organic meats and spectacular presentations within its location at the Monarch Beach Resort. Recognized as the #2 restaurant in the county in 2019 by the Orange County Register.

OUTER REEF

Boasting seafood straight from the Pacific, Outer Reef opens its doors in spring 2020 under the leadership of "Top Chef" contestant John Tesar. Dishes to look forward to include updated seafood creations, along with Chef Tesar's specialty dry-aged prime cuts. Located at the Laguna Cliffs Marriott.

RAYA

Showcasing Pan-Latin coastal cuisine from globally acclaimed chef Richard Sandoval, Raya's highlights include lobster tacos and stunning views of Salt Creek Beach. Ranked as one of the most romantic restaurants in Orange County by CBS Los Angeles, Raya is located at The Ritz-Carlton, Laguna Niguel.

OFFSITE VENUES

UNIQUE local venues

In addition to Dana Point's stellar resorts, each of these locales are ideal for hosting special events, from corporate conferences to weddings.

OCEAN INSTITUTE

Voted the town's best wedding venue by the Dana Point Times, the Institute is a nautical dream of a facility right on the water in Dana Point Harbor. Each of the Institute's three indoor-outdoor spaces feature expansive vistas of either the Harbor or the Pacific ocean, with a capacity of 20-200 people seated.

MISSION SAN JUAN CAPISTRANO

The seventh of 21 Spanish missions established in 18th century California, the Mission's historic adobe buildings and courtyards can accommodate up to 800 seated guests or 1,000 standing. Colorful gardens, koi fountains, and the famous migrating swallows contribute to the Mission's timeless appeal.

MONARCH BAY BEACH CLUB

Available only to Monarch Beach Resort members and overnight guests, the newly renovated Club features indoor/outdoor oceanfront dining with two breezy but intimate spaces for events. A semi-private dining room and main dining room can host 24 and 30 guests seated, respectively.

SURF HERITAGE AND CULTURE CENTER

Vintage surfboards line the walls at the Center's event space, evoking Southern California's extensive surfing history and relaxed beach culture. The Center can fit 120 seated guests and 250 standing indoors, with the option of expanding outside.

CASA ROMANTICA CULTURAL CENTER AND GARDENS

A former estate now registered historical landmark, Casa Romantica's blufftop location and lush gardens have enchanted visitors since 1927. Four event spaces within the property can accommodate up to 150 seated guests.



NEARBY attractions



ARTS & CULTURE

An artist colony for over a century, Laguna Beach is home to the world famous **Pageant of the Masters**, and multiple festivals showcasing California visual and performing arts throughout the year. (8 miles)

Visit **Mission San Juan Capistrano** to see the oldest standing building in California — the Mission's still active stone church — and over 240 years worth of artifacts that tell the story of the mission system and California's establishment as a state. The Mission's world famous migrating swallows and gorgeous gardens augment the historical treasures. (4.6 miles)

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Dubbed a "Smithsonian" of surf memorabilia by visitors, the **Surfing Heritage and Culture Center** has the world's largest collection of all things related to California's official state sport: history, art, media, and cool vintage surfboards from the sport's inception. (7.3 miles)

Dana Point's Lantern District in the town's center houses a growing number of shops, galleries, and restaurants. If you're curious about the street names — Street of the Violet Lantern, Golden Lantern, etc. — they're inspired by the merchant ships that used colored lanterns to advertise their wares in the town's early days.

SHOPPING

From upscale labels to casual beach chic, Orange County features some of the best shopping in the country. **South Coast Plaza** in Costa Mesa is the largest shopping center on the West Coast, and Orange County's hub for luxury shopping and top tier designer brands. It's impossible not to find something at the mall's 250+ boutiques and 30 restaurants. (26 miles)

An upscale outdoor mall, **Fashion Island in Newport Beach** features dozens of specialty boutiques and restaurants in the trendy Newport Center neighborhood. (15.4 miles)

Enjoy ocean views while browsing 65 discounted designer brands at the **Outlets at San Clemente**. Orange County's only coastal outlet shopping destination. (5 miles)

For a variety of independently owned boutiques, galleries, and restaurants that embody California Cool, head to **Laguna Beach's HIP District** (Historic and Interesting Places), which stretches for seven blocks along the Pacific Coast Highway. (7 miles)

DAY TRIP

Santa Catalina Island — often shortened to Catalina — has all the amenities of an island getaway (stunning scenery and relaxing

surroundings) coupled with fascinating history (a filming location and retreat for Hollywood celebrities). From Dana Point Harbor, Catalina is a 90 minute boat ride away on the Catalina Express, with year-round boat transportation. Explore the charming city of Avalon, hike the Trans Catalina Trail, or for an adventurous introduction, do the zipline eco tour. That's not to mention the family-friendly island's enviable shopping and cuisine. (37 nautical miles)

OUTDOORS BEYOND THE OCEAN

While water sports remain the gold standard of outdoor adventure in Dana Point, there's more to recreation here than the famous coastline.

Hike the Headlands A 60 acre marine nature preserve, the Headlands contains three miles of public access trails that meander through beaches, tide pools, and panoramic cliff views of the ocean and Harbor. Also an alternative whale watching spot, it's possible to see the animals in the waters

beyond the Harbor on a clear day. The Dana Point Nature Interpretive Center offers parking and more information on the area.

Golf at Monarch Beach Golf Links

Take in views of the ocean at every hole on the Monarch Beach Resort's stunning Scottish-style, par-70 championship golf course. Resort guests and the public can book tee times online at monarchbeachgolf.com.

Adventure in Laguna Coast Wilderness Park

This Orange County-owned wilderness area features forty miles of trails through woodlands, coastal canyons, and expansive ridgeline views. Visitors can independently hike, mountain bike, and horseback ride from dawn to dusk, and a variety of guided activities are offered by OC Parks. Visit ocparks.com for more information. (13 miles)

Nestled conveniently between Southern California's largest cities – Los Angeles and San Diego – Dana Point is easily accessed by car, plane, train, or bus.

BY PLANE

John Wayne Airport, Orange County (SNA) is the closest airport to Dana Point at only 22 miles away, and where you'll likely have the best experience: the airport was named the overall best airport in the U.S. in 2018 based on customer satisfaction. The only commercial service airport in Orange County, flights are offered by most major airlines with hundreds of daily domestic routes as well as international flights to and from Mexico and Canada. Five other major airports are within 100 miles of Dana Point.

BY CAR

Easily accessed from the north, south, and east via the Interstate 5 (I-5) Freeway or the Pacific Coast Highway, driving directions to Dana Point couldn't be simpler. From Los Angeles: Take the I-5 South to exit 79/CA-1. From San Diego: Take the I-5 North to exit 79/CA-1, towards the Pacific Coast Highway.

BY TRAIN

Take the Amtrak or Metrolink to the San Juan Capistrano train station — the closest to Dana Point. This is one of Amtrak's most unique depots, as passenger areas are housed in vintage boxcars. It's also convenient to get off the train in San Clemente: both stations are minutes down the road from Dana Point. From there, you can take a taxi, Uber, Lyft, or trolley right down to the beach.

TROLLEY AND PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Once you arrive in Dana Point, be sure to try the town's favorite mode of transportation during the summer: the free Dana Point Summer Trolley Service that runs through Labor Day. You can also ride the Metrolink commuter train or hop on an Orange County Bus through the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA).
